

## THE BASIS

The Republic of Iraq has been in a state of constant conflict since 2004. The conflict took another serious turn in 2014 with the capture of important parts of the country and specially the Al Anbar province by the Islamic State of Iraq and Levant (also referred to as Daesh/IS).

The Al Anbar province is the largest province in Iraq and extends over most of the country. It is on the border with Jordan, Saudi Arabia and Syria hence of great strategic and military importance. As of July 2016 all of the Anbar province except for Al Qa'aim is under the control of the national government and free from the ISIL/DAESH occupation

## THE ISSUE

The existing infrastructure has been completely destroyed in the years of occupation.

There is an urgent need to assist the local communities of Al Anbar to start rebuilding the infrastructure such that current residents may begin their return to normalcy and displaced residents feel secure to return

This empowerment of the local community will assist in building a positive climate which in turn will support reconstruction of the social fabric and infrastructure.



## THE PROJECT

During armed conflict, girls are subject to widespread and, at times, systematic forms of human rights violations that have mental, emotional, spiritual, physical and material repercussions.

They lose their childhoods, homes, families, continuity of education friends and social structure

A school is a first step in providing a safe environment, reestablishment of community and a visible sign of return to normalcy

The Al Ezdhar Middle School for girls has been chosen for the purpose of pilot project. This school is located in the Al Shirka district of Al Anbar and needs extensive rehabilitation.

There are 16 class rooms and one big meeting room (auditorium) in addition to the administration rooms and other services. The school has suffered extensive damage as illustrated by the photographs.

When it was operational it was attended by 375 students

This school/s can be used further on as a community outreach center and dispense primary care to mothers and children. Once the structure is rehabilitated it can be used to dispense food and shelter during the day, and can also be used to provide part time instruction to youth, as a basic health-care center and be repurposed as a focal point of the community in general.
